# The defining book on African oral literature has been made available to a new generation of scholars.

Open Book Publishers (Cambridge, UK), together with the World Oral Literature Project (Cambridge and Yale), has released a revised edition of Ruth Finnegan's classic study, *Oral Literature in Africa*. The book was hailed as groundbreaking when it was published in 1970, and it continues to be the go-to text for scholars in the field. However, until now, it was out-of-print and increasingly difficult to find, especially in Africa.

This new edition makes the work freely available to use and share under a Creative Commons (CC-BY) license. For the first time, young Africans will be able to read this priceless record of the cultures and languages of their grandparents and great-grandparents, while scholars around the world will be able to read the work on any electronic reading device.

It includes a new introduction, additional images and an updated bibliography, as well as its original chapters on poetry, prose, "drum language" and drama, and an overview of the social, linguistic and historical background of oral literature in Africa.

The volume is complemented by original recordings of stories and songs from the Limba country (Sierra Leone), collected by Finnegan during her fieldwork in the late 1960s, which can be freely accessed online.

The free digital editions and online archive were financed by the collective support of readers and scholars. Donations were made via an innovative crowdfunding platform, Unglue.it, which quickly raised the target amount of US\$7,500.
